Thanks very much for your brief report which is exactly the kind of thing we need.

I think it is for you to decide whether to submit your formal paper to this Society or to one of the other journals mentioned in your letter of January 3. Our position is that the Society wishes to publish any work done under one of our grants which is sound and well written in the opinion of our expert advisers. Whether or not a paper interests any large number of readers is not as important as that it should be instructive and helpful to scholars in its field.

The question for you is whether publication in our PROCEEDINGS or TRANSACTIONS would reach the audience most important for you. My personal supposition, after reading your report, is that one or the other of the two more technical journals would probably do this, but my opinion would not sway our Committee on Publications.
