Dear Professor Ferrater Mora:

Thank you for your letter of February 5. The date, Tuesday, February 28, and the title, "The Idea of Man: An Outline of Philosophical Anthropology", of your lecture agree exactly with the records I have of our previous correspondence.

The lecture will be at 8 p.m. on that Tuesday, probably following a dinner given by the trustees of the Lindley fund. We would be delighted to have you arrive on Monday, and to show you the University and have the opportunity of conversing with you, and I suppose, if air travel is still disrupted, there might be something to be said for that arrangement also as providing a safe margin of time. If things are normal, however, and if it is more convenient for you, an arrival in Kansas City (there are no planes to Lawrence, which is forty miles west of Kansas City; if you will let us know your flight number, somebody will meet you at the airport) by the early afternoon of Tuesday would be perfectly all right. In that case we would of course like to have you stay over until some time on Wednesday, in order once again to have some leisure for discussion, and so on. It is unlikely in any case that there would be a flight which you could take on Tuesday night, but if you arrived on Monday we could take you to the plane as early as necessary on Wednesday morning.
