Dear Professor Ferrater:

In reply to the request for information in your letter of March 29, I was born in Washington, D. C. on June 14, 1903. I am unable immediately to supply the corresponding information about the others named in your letter, but I would suggest that you can obtain it, in the case of those who are alive, by writing to the person concerned (see addresses in the current membership list of the Association for Symbolic Logic), and in the case of those who have died, by consulting obituaries which were published in Volume III of Studia Philosophica. Unfortunately, this Polish periodical is not too easy to obtain, but I am sure there must be copies in university libraries in this country which can be located if you look around for it. There is no copy in the Princeton Library, and though I saw the periodical at the time that it came for review in the Journal of Symbolic Logic, I now no longer have it available; my recollection is that our review copy went to Professor Hempel, but you may find it preferable to look for a copy in a library from which it could be sent to you on interlibrary loan.

The present expectation is that Volume I of the Introduction to Mathematical Logic will be out before the end of 1955. I do not see how I can promise that absolutely, but of course it would be possible to check the matter again later, when correcting proof of the article. Dictionery)
