Dear Prof. Ferrater,

Thank you for your letter. –I do regret that so large a proportion of our review of the *Diccionario de Filosofía* had to be devoted to corrections, but it was Prof. Quine's opinion (and I concurred) that this was necessary in the interest of accuracy. The Dictionary as a whole is impressive. Moreover I fully appreciate the point that you spent a great deal of time and effort in order to provide adequate coverage in a domain which was only rather lightly touched upon in the previous edition, and that the process of revision and reconsideration was even still going on as the Dictionary was being printed – as is clear from amendments and additions made in the appendix. Annoying typographical errors that must have escaped correction in proof are another indication of the magnitude of the task you had undertaken.

In connection with your order for the June number of the Journal, and the Bibliography, I am forwarding your letter to our business office in New Brunswick. I assume they will reach you in due course.
