Dear Mrs Ferrater

The carbon copy of your letter of July 7, addressed to Mary in our care here arrived this morning. The original, sent to Lake Forest will also undoubtedly arrive here in a few days, as Mary is now travelling in New Mexico, bound for California, until about Aug. 7, and all her mail is being relayed from Lake Forest here, for us to hold for here when she gets here in August. [...il-legible] answering your letter.

As regards your questions, we have ourselves heard very little from Ted since his departure, except that Jaime joined him June 26 in Brussels as planned and they left there the next day. They changed their plans and were apparently in Paris from July 3 to July 9 (today) when they were to go to Cologne and from there on July 10 to Copenhagen, where they should be until July 18 – 19. Ted tells us we may write him, % American Express in Copenhagen until then. No doubt you can write Jaime there also. Originally they had a reservation at the Hotel Hansar 9 Keligolandsgade, Copenhagen V, Denmark, for July [...il·legible], but since they have changed their plans, they may not be able to get into that hotel now. You might send Jaime a letter % American Express, Llagmarhrve, H.C. Andersens Boulevard [...il·legible] Copenhagen, Denmark, if it can reach there at least by July 18.

An address a little later, as they have a reservation at Hotel Royale, Rue Royale, Calais, France, where they should be on the night of July 22, should be more likely to catch him before his crossing to England next day. I suggest you write him both to Copenhagen and Calais and request him to send you details of his trip up to that point. We ourselves have very little from Ted (except that they changed their plans at the start), and I know Mary has no information at all from Ted.

We ourselves received here on our arrival June 21, a letter of early June from your husband asking for some information, so he could make up Jaime's budget. As by June 21<sup>st</sup>, both you and Jaime had departed, I had then no address to send you the information. It is as follows (Ted also has been informed).

Aside from payment for Jaime's air passage both ways, you have paid me the following:

For ½ of one night for a room at the Hotel Bedford, Brussels \$3.83
For ½ of one night for a room at the [Grand?] Palace, London \$5.25
For Jaime's fare as a passenger on the ferry from Calais to Dover (this does not cover any part of the car ferry cont) \$5.85

\$14.93

All other hotel and travel costs are to be settled between Ted and Jaime as they arise.
