I have suggested that he write to you to see what is going on (his undergraduate record was high; here; his Chicago record--graduate work in English--is spotty because he fell ill while there; his Claremont transcript should be excellent). And I have suggested that he go down to visit ~~once~~ again before definitely turning loose of his grant of money from Claremont. But I suspect that Kroll would ultimately really prefer doing his work at Bryn Mawr with you and others there; and I think you would be glad to have lured him away from Claremont.
