Typing at Shipley, packing possessions in my apartment –these things have occupied much of my time this summer, and I have done little intellectual work. I hope I've not forgotten what such work is! I suspect that they will look for evidences of a capacity to do it when I get to San Francisco. I do expect, by the way, to leave along about the 14th.

I have heard –though not yet officially- that the California legislature has passed a bill to increase the salaries of the faculty members of the state colleges by 1010. A fine thing – it will bring me up to approximately 7.750.
