Dear Professor Ferrater Mora:

I am grateful for your reply to my letter proposing a book for the Twayne series on Ortega y Gasset, but regretful that you feel you cannot do the book. I can see that you have major plans for future projects, and I wish you every success with them. Thank you very much for the address of Julián Marías; I shall write to him today. I know who he is of course; everybody does, nearly. I knew that he had taught in this country a few years ago, but have not met him personally and did not know whether his English would be entirely adequate for doing a book on Ortega. I assume you know that it is, or that he may find some one to translate for him if necessary. What we shall want is a book that is scholarly but not bearing the technicalities of the professional philosopher; this he can manage, surely. We are more interested in Ortega as a literary man than as the professional philosopher.
