Editing in order to eliminate syntactical clumsinesses, seemingly irrelevant asidds, etc. would provide a more smooth delivery but to the sacrifice of freshness.

As a matter of fact, In had started making a few biographical corrections on page 1, when I realized that, oin page 2, I pointed out to Mr. Kostelanetz that the biography could be straightened out, and that yet...If you think that my parenthetical remark to that effect is more effective and/or amusing than keeping the record straight, then none of my corrections on page 1 are necessary (but then, of course, the aforementioned parenthetical remark should be kept). Do as you think it best.
