→ I began thinking about this subject a number of years ago in a graduate seminar on the history of concepts. I made an oral presentation to that seminar with exclusive reference to library science sources (I had worked as a paraprofessional in libraries by then several years). Since that time I have kept wishing I could take the topic up again.

I would start the projected paper with an analytical examination of recent literature on classification of the sciences. Second, I would focus on the particular position of psychology in classification arrangements over the centuries, as a concrete test for some of the central ideas advanced in the body of the study. And, third, I would try to derive some conclusions from the evidence discussed, concerning the relations between ways the sciences have been classified and the prevalent philosophical perspectives at various points in time and parts of the world (I was very interested by Dr. Subramanyam's discussion of the Colon system in Fundamentals).

My assumption is that this project will help to make me a better cataloguer because I will become more sensitive to the prejudices behind the several systems of classification.
