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# Instructions to the Contributors of *Studies on Bunge's Treatise*

## 1. Length, Orthography, and Style

All papers must be typed. All lines must be double-spaced. No paper should exceed 30 pages, including notes and references. Please number all pages.

Please keep consistently to British orthography or to American orthography; do not mix them up.

People tend to underrate papers lacking in grammar or style. Hence, if English is not your first language please let a native speaker of English check your paper for spelling mistakes, grammatical errors and stylistic lapses.

## 2. Italics

Titles of published books and journals, foreign words, phrases requiring emphasis, and all variables should be typed in italics. If your typewriter does not allow for italics, indicate italicized words by underlining.

## 3. Illustrations, formulas, and logical symbols

All illustrations must be professionally drawn and camera ready.

All formulas and equations should be put in a form that helps to minimize the number of printed lines. Hence, avoid bi-level and tri-level equations as far as possible.

Please use the following standard logical notation:  $\neg$ ,  $\wedge$ ,  $\vee$ ,  $\rightarrow$ ,  $\leftrightarrow$ ,  $\forall$ ,  $\exists$ .

## 4. Section Headings

For sections beginning with an explicitly stated topic phrase which summarizes the section, begin with an arabic numeral followed by the phrase, for example, **2. Bunge's View of Scientific Theories**. If your sections do not have introductory phrases, place a roman numeral at the center of the page before each new section.

## 5. Citation

A bibliographical list of cited references beginning with the author's last name, initials, followed by the year of publication in parentheses must be headed **References** and placed on a separate sheet in alphabetical order. Simple citations or quotation attributions should then be made by employing the reference

list in the text rather than by footnotes. So, please, do not misuse footnotes as a substitute for a list of references.

Cite author and year of publication, for instance, (Bunge 1974) and, when appropriate, page numbers (Bunge 1974, p. 31). If the context clearly specifies the reference, the year and page number are sufficient, for example, " ... Comparing Bunge's theory of reference (1974, pp. 32-82) with his earlier remarks in (1967a), we find ... ".

## 7. Footnotes

If you wish to include a footnote acknowledging support or discussions, it should be the first footnote and indicated by a star (\*) symbol after your name on the first page.

Discursive footnotes should be kept to an absolute minimum. Incorporate the material in the body of the text whenever possible. Please number your discursive footnotes consecutively throughout the typescript.

All footnotes should be double spaced with the heading **Footnotes** and appended to the article after the list of references.
