Dear Professor Ferrater Mora,

On my return from a longish stay in England and France a few days ago I found awaiting me here the four volumes of your Diccionario de Filosofía. It was most kind of you to send me this work. Not only do I appreciate it as a gift, but I shall also find it very useful as a work of reference. (Fortunately, my Spanish is good enough for reading purposes.) I have already had a look at a good many of the articles - including, of course, the one about myself. I am full of admiration for the enormous efforts and hard labour behind this great opus. One of the features which makes it outstanding in its genre is the even balance between the Anglo-Saxon, the German, and the Latin traditions in philosophy.

After all which I have received from you I have the rudeness of asking you an additional favour: Could you send me a xerox copy of your paper "Wittgenstein o la destrucción". I have read it (long ago) and also had it but I cannot find it now and I should like to have a copy at hand. I thought it very interesting.

I hope they will be elected. - I hope there will be a meeting of the I.I.P. in Spain one day; do you think you might be able to inspire our common friend Manuel Garrido to take an initiative?
