Dear Mr. Ferrater:

Thank you for your request for information regarding our line of Motion Picture Splicers. We are pleased to enclose a catalog sheet and price list covering same. They are available in both our Miracle Model and Hercules Model.

Specifically, the Miracle Model is a butt-welder which joins film end to end using nothing but the film itself. The Hercules Model accomplishes the splice by the addition of a mylar strip 1/1000" thick by ½" wide. This is coated with a thermo-setting adhesive compatible to all film bases and eliminates all the undesirable properties of pressure sensitive tape. It also makes possible the splicing of different types of film bases whereas the Miracle Model can splice only like films.

Splicing on either machine can be accomplished in about 15 seconds. The cost of the splice on the Miracle is only time as nothing is added. The cost of the material for the Hercules splice is less than 2¢ per splice which is 1/3 less than the conventional undesirable pressure sensitive patches.

The major benefit of our equipment to the Motion Picture Maker is its ability to eliminate a large portion of the A&B process, thereby realizing substantial savings. A sample print made from a negative spliced without the A&B process, the 2 scenes having been actually butt-welded together, is enclosed for your evaluation.
