I note in your letter that you would be interested in splicing <u>raw stock</u> as you wish to make use of reversal processing for your film. Unfortunately, a butt fusion creates an exposure line when used on <u>raw stock</u> which would not be good for purposes of elimination of A&B editing.

I can assure you that a butt fusion is a flat single thickness weld and will not throw out-of-focus any frames and can be used in a contact printer as well as an optical printer. When run through a projector, no extraneous noises are introduced and when properly framed, no splice is visible.

We do not have a representative or a dealer in your area and might suggest, as you recommended, that you contact us prior to your going to Europe. Please keep in mind that our plant will be closed from July 2nd through July 16th. Excluding this date, we will avail ourselves to you at your convenience.
