Jeze Cruz Cesta, Prefessor of thilesephy at the University of Sze Paule, is known in philesephicul and historical circles throughout the Americas as the outstanding contemperary histerian of ideas in Brasil. I am certain that you count him as an acquantaince of mot a personal friend.

You will be disturbed to learn, then, that an order has been issued for his imprisement as a "protective measure" for the security of the present national regime. On Friday might, September 4th, the Department of Political and Social Order (DOIS), Brasil's Internal Socialty Political and Social Order (DOIS), Brasil's Internal Socialty Political and Social Order (DOIS), Brasil's Internal Socialty Political and Social Order (DOIS), Brasil's Region to arrest and imprison Cruz Costa along with one student and three other professors, including the world-renewmed physicist, Marie Schemberg. This is the latest in a series of imprisonments, exiles and harassments by which the present "revolutionary" government, under the gre text of anti-communism and anti-subversion, is attempting to suppress opposition by creating an atmosphere of fear and intiodation in intellectual cirches.

None of the five had been tecated by pelice as of this writing. Meanwhile an appeal signed by 113 artists, architects, art critics and other intellectuals calling for revocation of the order was presented to President Castelle Brande in See Faule Saturday noon on the occasion of the official inauguration of the VIII² Bienal of Nedern Art. Schemberg, in addition to being an outstanding physicist, is known also as an art critic and was a member of the jury which made the selection for Bienal exhibition.

Castelle Brance presissed to study the appeal. During his 16 months in Wifice he has developed a reputation for fairness and moderation, frequently having veteos decisions taken by the "Binha dura" (hard-line), of the military brass. The four professors involved, Crum Costa, Schemberg, Florestam Fernandes and Fernandes Harrique Cardese, had been accused of subversive tendencies avercal menths ago but no hearig has been held either for formal presentation of charges or to provide opportunity for defense. No evidence has been presented to support the accusations. The faculty of the Scheel of Philosophy, University of Sao Paule, on April 13 memorialized the University's President and Beard of Trustees that such threats to professors and students be removed in order that research and study might continue within the atmosphere of freedom so essential to the proper functioning of a university.

To consider Cruz Cesta a danger to the present regime is, of course, patently absurd. There is clearly no justification whatever to imprise him. If pressure of world epinion in the name of academic freedom can be brought against such irresponsible and morale-damaging acts of Brasil's military government, then favorable action probably may be expected from Castello Brance. Can we count on your support in this matter? Address a letter or cablergem of protest to
