However, the back of the jacket propagates some serious misinformation about me, which I should like to have set right. ~~As~~ I take it that these are advance copies. Can you tell me what the publication date is to be?

It was more than kind of you to mention me in your new Preface.

I am sorry that Rahv failed to see the light in regard to "The Intellectual." I have no other connections with editors of magazines (except "Harper's Bazaar" - which I think is hardly to be thought of in this case). But I might suggest your trying "The Anchor Review" or "New World Writing", both of ~~them~~ which try to be a more "permanent" sort of publication and ~~perhaps~~ may therefore be less afraid of "abstraction." And there is a new magazine to appear this fall, called ~~the~~ "The Literary Review" ^{University?} and published at (or by) Fairleigh Dickinson College, which is somewhere in New Jersey (I have heard of it because a friend of mine is to have an article in the first issue). It might be worth a try.

I hope you are finding your Princeton-Bryn Mawr existence not too arduous.
