Thank you for your note from Bryn Mawr. I was glad to learn that you had arrived safely.

Thank you too for sending me the "Tripitaka," which has just arrived. Please let me know how much it cost, so that I may reimburse you.

Also just arrived is the Regnery carbon of the translation. I wrote to them just before leaving Northampton, to give them my new address in case they should still be thinking of sending it to me. This apparently ~~has~~ predded them into action. If you do not need it, I should like to keep it ^{for} reference until my own carbon makes its way back to me. They sent it by "express collect" and the charge was \$2.18.
