We have some relations that we can stay with in N.Y. and H.K. nearly always has something to do so we are up more often than we use to be. In a way it was nice to get back to Tuscaloosa on Saturday, so quiet and uncrowded.

I have an article on Jjai Twe which is being published shortly in Zygon. I make a reference to your "Being and Death". I am very with it and will send you a copy as soon it is out. Now that classes are over I am going to get busy on something else. I have been very tired this last year, but am feeling great now. Swimming almost everyday. The end of June we are going to Rio for 10 days. H.K. is speaking at an international seminar for insurance companies. I haven't been back since the summer of '62 when I visited my physics lab partner. She is married now with two children and a busy career as a business consultant, but back in Rio. I love old friends –the best thing about growing older.

I believe you told me that you were retiring from teaching this spring. Too bad for the students. I still think of all those courses took from you with the greatest delight and can recall certain moment with such immediacy. I am really feeling terribly sentimental.
