I have been recently appointed adviser to the Philosophy Club which is just forming. We have a larger number of majors than usual. —over 20 juniors and seniors and about the same number of minors. This will be the first year we will be awarding the Marten and Marie Ten Hoor Prize to an outstanding student in philosophy, so this good year will be really topped off by your visit.

Have you thought of what might like to speak on? Try to think of some way to include the interest of the Spanish Dept., whatever they are. Perhaps you being a Spanish philosopher is enough, but since they have been very good about making arrangements, I don't want them to think they were left out. Looking forward to hearing from you soon.
