I have never written anything on education, as far as I can remember, and very little (and only in passing) on hermeneutics. There are a number of items in my Diccionario de filosofía concerning Hermeneutics and related fields, but I am sure you know all about it. An implicit critique of (excessive) hermeneutical claims is in chapter VI ("ILa estructura de lo que hay"), section i ("El criterio ontológico"), pp 88-99 of Fundamentos de filosofía (a complete rewriting of El ser vel sentido). filosofía (a complete rewriting of El ser y el sentido), particularly in so far as the so-called (by Rorty) "hard textual reading" is concerned. This piece, by the way, may appear in English eventually, but probably not before 1988.
