Dear Senor Faust

Thank you for your letter. I have not yet received the bulbils but have today sent you a parcel of Crocus corms. You did not say what species you required and possibly you already grow some of those sent but that cant be helped. They were all planted in the borders and some were already in growth. It is possible that an odd rogue has got into some of the plantings but I think that most of them are true to name. I have a very large collection of the genus, about 120 species and varieties but unfortunately only very few of many kinds. If there are any species that you are particularly anxious to obtain you must send me the names and I will do what I can even it is only a single corm from which you can propagate. I myself am very anxious to obtain the Portuguese C. Clusii.

Please let me know whether the corms arrive in good condition so that I shall know what to do another time.
