The film was in perfect shape before it was sent to Kodak for the sound tracks. It came back with so many scratches that one wonders whether someone tried to sabotagw this service by liberally sprinkling sand on the machine. As it is now, the film is practically unusable.

Kodak should be ashamed of this kind of service. The job was so sloppy that not even the least reputable firm in the most backward country imaginable would dare to send back film in this condition. Obviously, no one cared to check the work. Scratches increase in number and size as the film advances. Kodak's --of the Kodak subcontractor's- incompetence and carelessness in this area is truly appaling.
