Because I am leaving Princeton so soon, I am sending you the review copy of the paper at once, without waiting for your reply to this card. If after examining the paper you decide that you prefer not to review it, then please return the review copy to me at 402 West Iowa St., Urbana, Illinois.

However, I have no objection to a very short review of Klimovsky or for any other reason. If you do review Monteiro's paper, you may wish to ask a mathematician to collaborate (I leave that to you). My hasty superficial impression of Monteiro's paper is that is a good paper, probably more original than Klimovsky, but written almost entirely from the point of view of abstract algebra rather than logic. Any review of the papers must be devoted primarily to parts of the paper that border on the field of the J.S.L., especially the treatment of "Brouwerian algebra" or "Brouwerian dattices" but also to a lesser extent the author's treatment of lattices in general and of Boolean algebra.

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
