Dear Mr. Ferrater Mora,

Yes, when Father Henry was here in San Francisco recently to give lectures at both the University of San Francisco (Jesuit) and San Francisco State College, I ascertained that he didn't realize that your Diccionario has been published in a new edition. I can understand your dismay, and yet of course you should not be dismayed at all. Father Henry mentioned the article to me again and remarked that it was "extraordinary" and "wonderful." It is obviously too late in the year (he returns to France in mid-June) for the University of California at San Diego to get a copy of your D. for him to see ~~it~~ before he leaves. So tomorrow I shall get hold of the new edition of your Diccionario from our library here (I ordered it first thing in the fall, and it came some time ago) and get the article on persona Xeroxed. Plus final examinations to make up and administer and look over (I shall have good help in the reading of these, but I don't like not to read them at all myself).

Thank you for your summer address. My own, if you should need it, had better be my parents' Dallas one, for mail could be forwarded to me from there. It is: 2919 Ramsey Avenue, Dallas, Texas. Yes, I hope that we can see one another in August.

Remember me to your wife. I hope that you both have a good summer in Spain and elsewhere. <sup>Be careful in Barcelona! The news reports</sup> <sup>are alarming.</sup>
