Dear Mr. Ferrater Mora,

I had sworn not to consider applying to any other one of the California state Colleges. But today I have had an inquiry from one of them, and I have decided to make application for the position open there.

The reason for this decision is that the College <sup>apparently</sup> manages to keep the great majority of its classes down to a maximum of ~~sweaty~~ students (it has a few big lecture classes, very big lectures classes, and that apparently allows permits them to keep all the rest of the classes manageable in size). I would have twelve hours a week there, too, and moreover this College is on the quarter system. Which means that I'd teach a total of about sixty students three times a year.
