Enclosed is a copy of "Believing and Disbelieving." I don't know whether you will be interested in this sort of thing. It does contain an analysis of the Hangman's Paradox which I first heard of from you. As I recall, we were all thoroughly amused in Aristotle one sunny, wintry afternoon.

I didn't realize that you were so interested in photography and film-making. I was very interested in reading your remarks in "Bryn Mawr Now." Your exemplary stories struck me initially as depressing, then funny, and finally as philosophical indeed.

Since last spring I have given up being angry with all the members of my department and half of the world. Now I am rather indifferent and amused by all the members of my department and half of the world, better all of the world. In any case, I think I have a better attitude. We would still like to move, but are being more patient. Fortunately H.K. has been appointed as a consultant, on a part-time basis, to the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency, U.S. Treasury, to do a national study which should be of considerable significance. He had initiated a similar study when he was associated with the Office in Boston.

We are coming to Philadelphia on December 17. On the 18th, H.K. is attending a conference at the Wharton School. I hope to be able to come out to Bryn Mawr for the day to see the College. Will it still be open? Do you have the same office? I would like to see you very much too. I will probably take the train out of Philadelphia around 10 o'clock. Please, let me know if you will be there. (on the morning of the 18th)
