He was my student at the Graduate Philosophy Department of Bryn Mawr College for a period of two full years, and worked for me, as a bibliography assistant, during two years, in the course of the preparation of the latest edition (4 vols.) of my *Dictionary of Philosophy*. Ever since Mr. Montoya came to study for his doctoral degree at Bryn Mawr College I knew of his wish to obtain also a professional degree in Library Science. He has informed me that he has the opportunity to obtain this degree in the course of the present year thanks largely to a tuition scholarship at Drexel University for 3 quarters last summer. He is now applying for another scholarship from the Medical Library Association which will permit him to take a fourth quarter and complete a Master's degree. I know he is doing very well at Drexel University, and I am sure that with the help of the Medical Library Association scholarship he will be able to complete his work soon so that he may apply for a position in some Medical School library.

Mr. Montoya's interest in Medicine from the philosophical and historical points of view leaves no room for doubt. I understand that he would like to consider the possibility of continuing teaching.
