
Dear Professor Ferrater Mora:

You embarrass me greatly by your kindness in sending me your book Man at the Crossroads and the several articles. This is a totally unforeseen consequence of my inquiry about the English and Spanish versions, and if I had anticipated it I would not have asked. Yet now that events have fallen this way I must say that I am as delighted as I am grateful. I had intended to write to thank you immediately after getting the book and articles, but I paused to try to find a copy of an article and of my one book. I have found them both now and will send them immediately. I wish the exchange were a fair one.

I find that I'll have to postpone any questions for the courses I mentioned. I have been involved this year in a new course for some honors students, but I expected some relief next year. Since writing you, however, I have found myself on a newly appointed committee for the re-organization of the College and in another group that is exploring the possibility of some rather drastic changes in the freshman and sophomore years. I need to do a lot of work before I can ask the sort of questions I will eventually have to ask. I might mention, though, that I have thought of translating José Gaos' Antología del Pensamiento de Lengua Española en la Edad Contemporánea whenever I can be free to turn my efforts in this direction.

I am very sorry that we cannot anticipate a visit from you in the foreseeable future, but I still hope that we can work something out later on. My deepest thanks, again, for your publications and for your helpful letter.
