I know that you will be quite unhappy at not finding a third chapter in this envelope which you have just opened. However, you do have the second corrected chapter now. I was sorry to see the MS. go off to a publisher before I had revised your revision.

I hope you will have the second chapter typed up as it now stands and use it instead of the second chapter now in your hands. I feel very honored to be doing the translation and hope that the quality of my work will offset the long time it is taking me to finish. I read with great pleasure a review of Meyer's L'ontologie de Miguel de Unamuno (C. Zardoya), and was glad to see that he feels you are the only critic so far to be on the right "track".

Since I am here at Princeton, it seems to me (selfishly) that their Press might be a good one to publish with. I know their distribution to be good and they do advertise their wares in the New York Times Book Section. But that is up to you. There is also the fact that it would probably be given to someone in the Spanish Dept. for judgement reading. In short you have a "fifth column" here as nowhere else except perhaps Harvard.
