Dear Professor Mora,

Thank your very nice letter of the 9th.

I would be very pleased to meet you in England during your sabbatical year. When do you think that you might come to London? Please let me know about this. I shall be sailing for the United States at the end of March. I think (although this is not absolutely certain) that on the 28th or 30th of March there will be a fairwell party for me, and quite a number of my friends will come. Among them a few philosophers. I would be delighted if you could join us. Do you think that there is some possibility that you might be in England at that time? (Alternatively, I return to England for a fortnight in June as I must be in Oxford then.)

I should tell you that Philosophy Today was really discovered by my wife. Her field is English, but her understanding of philosophical problems, at any rate "basic" problems as she likes to call them, is quite reliable. She first read your book and said that it was "absolutely fascinating." She has an appreciation of grace and beauty of style. She consequently compelled me to read the book. So this is the story. As a matter of fact, she has said that she would like to meet the person who could write such a book. So you will be welcome by both of us.

I have not heard from Professor Kline although I wrote to him some months' ago. I don't know whether it is correct to write to him again. Do you think that you might write to him yourself on my behalf? As yet I have not secured for myself any post and am just in the process of doing so at this moment. I am rather mystified by the intricacies of American academic life, so I would be very grateful if you could give me some advice about the "rules of the game." However, I feel that not much can be done before I arrive in the United States.
