Dear Professor Ferrater-Mora:

I am writing to give you a cordial invitation to take part in a round-table discussion which will be led by Dr. Jose Miranda, of Mexico City, and will be held in my office, 207 Bennett Hall, from 4 to about 5:30 p.m., Wednesday May 21.
