I regret to inform you that my paper for the Philosophy of History course will have to be turned in when the fall semester begins. If you recall, I had spoken to you concerning the fact that it would be very difficult for me to complete the paper before you left the campus for the summer. At that time you mentioned that graduate students could turn in incomplete work at the opening of the next school year.
