Dear Jose,

Thank you very much for answering my letter so promptly and sympathetically. Well, I have heard nothing as yet from Mrs. Cauman, although I have called and written. I really don't expect an answer and will be surprised if I get one. I honestly think they did not even bother to read my paper. There is still a chance of it being published. I saw Hintikka at the APA meeting, discussed the matter with him and gave him a copy of the paper. He told me that he had been planning to answer Linsky in the Finnish Year Book to be published in May and that he thought my paper could probably be published along with his comments on it. This of course would be fine. But, I have not heard from him as yet.

The job outlook seems rather grim. I was told that the Simmons people interviewed 50 people at the APA meeting. When I went up to speak to them once, they seemed very self-important and otherwise engaged. There is only one other opening that I have heard of in the area at a place called Suffolk University, which almost no one has ever heard of, but I have written them a letter. Will be very disappointed if I cannot get a job teaching somewhere. The graduate schools seem to have trained too many Ph.D.'s.

Was very sorry not to see you at the meeting in New York. No one I saw said they had seen you so I assume you were not there. It was more pleasant than most as far as I was concerned, possibly because I spent less time there and more time in the city at large. The crowds were broken up into various rooms which made it less of a mob scene. From the old days I only saw Mr. Leblanc.

I am working very hard now after the holidays to get my dissertation finished in good time. There is still quite a lot to do. Will let you know how I get along and whatever happens to that paper.

If you have a chance to write I would be very interested to know what has been happening to my dear old college. What do you think of Mrs. Wofford? We were in St. Davids on Dec. 26th and drove around in the snow by the college. Brought back many memories. Would also like to hear some news of you.

Again many thanks for writing such a nice letter. I was so crushed at the time.
